

All Participants in the Canal Winchester Labor Day Festival Parade must agree to the following parade rules:

RULES AND REGULATIONS:

ALL ENTRANTS:

- 1. All parade entries must add entertainment value to the parade.
- 2. All commercial entries must be a float or highly decorated vehicle or an antique vehicle. Wrapped vehicles regularly driven on the road are strictly prohibited unless pulling a float.
- 3. All entries must stage in their assigned spot or will be removed from parade.
- 4. Candy, souvenirs or any other items may NOT be thrown from vehicles. Candy must be handed out by walkers
- 5. No materials may be distributed along the route during the parade. The prohibitions on throwing or distributing materials will be strictly enforced by the parade officials.
- 6. Alcoholic beverages are not allowed in the staging area or along the parade route.
- 7. Water guns, "super-soakers," and water balloons are strictly prohibited.
- 8. Automobiles not officially entered in the parade are not permitted in the parade staging area.
- 9. Members of groups who wish to ride in the parade must do so on a single float or truck, not in individual cars. The exception to this would be the use of antique vehicles as defined below.
- 10. No one can enter or exit any parade vehicle (including floats) while it is moving. Communication must be made with the driver to bring the vehicle to a full stop so riders can enter or exit the vehicle safely.
- 11. Horses must wear diapers or be followed by cleanup crew.
- 12. No single entry may exceed 25 participants unless pre-approved by the Parade Committee.



RULES AND REGULATIONS, CONT.:

ANTIQUE/SPECIAL INTEREST VEHICLES:

1. All antique cars should have a sign indicating the year and make.

FLOATS:

- 1. State law prohibits riding to and from the parade on a float.
- 2. For safety reasons, all floats must be pulled and a "non-jack knifing" linkage must be used. No driver or any other rider may be concealed inside the float.
- 3. All motorized vehicles must be operated by individuals properly licensed for the type of vehicle being used.
- 4. Float decorations may not interfere with a vehicle operator's clear and unobstructed view of the route. Exhaust systems must remain unobstructed. Fire proof or fire retardant construction materials are strongly encouraged.
- 5. Due to low hanging power lines, lights and trees, the overall height of an entry cannot exceed 13'-6".
- 6. Your entry number sign, which will be sent with your parade kit, must be prominently displayed on the left side of the vehicle.
- 7. All entries that include children must have an adequate number of adult leaders to supervise.
- 8. Optional judging of floats will take place 2 hours prior to parade start.
- 9. The parade awards will be announced before the parade steps off.
